NOTICE OF MEETING OF BOARD OF DETERMINATION

Notice Is Hereby Given to you as a person owning lands liable for an assessment or a public corporation subject to assessment, that the Board of Determination will meet on **Thursday, May 22nd, 2014 at 7 p.m. at the Manistee Township Hall located at 410 Holden St Manistee, Michigan** to hear all interested persons and evidence and to determine whether the actions drains as prayed for in the petition dated December 17th 2012, for the maintenance, repair and improvement of the Drain pursuant to Act 40 of the Public Acts of 1956, as amended, is necessary and conducive to the public health, convenience or welfare, and whether said Drain is necessary for the protection of the public health of Manistee Township in accordance with Section 72 and 191 of Act 40 of the Public Acts of 1956, as amended, and to further determine whether the addition and/or deletion of lands to the McGuineas Drain Drainage District as recommended by a licensed engineer or surveyor will more accurately define the boundaries of the land benefitted by the Drain, and whether such addition and/or deletion of lands is necessary just and equitable pursuant to Section 197 of Act No. 40, P.A. 1956, as amended

Proceedings conducted at this public hearing will be subject to the provisions of the Michigan Open Meetings Act and you are further notified that information regarding this meeting may be obtained from the County Drain Commissioners Office located at 415 Third Street Manistee, Michigan Persons with disabilities needing accommodations for effective participation in the meeting should contact the County Drain Commissioner at 231-398-3507 or through the Michigan Relay Center at 1-800-649-3777 (TDD) at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting to request mobility, visual, hearing or other assistance. Minutes of the meeting will be on file in the Manistee County Drain Commissioner's office.

You Are Further Notified, that persons aggrieved by the decisions of the Board of Determination may seek judicial review in the Circuit Court for the County of Manistee within ten (10) days of the determinations. If the actions prayed for in the Petition are determined to be necessary and conducive to the public health, convenience or welfare, a special assessment may be levied against the properties that benefit from the project. Any landowner or party with an interest in the property to be assessed, or their agent, may appear in person to comment on the necessity of the project.
