Gary Sinise Foundation

Actor Gary Sinise is best known for his role as Lt. Dan in the 1994 movie *Forest Gump*. He became an active supporter of veterans and first responders after 9/11 when he started devoting his time and energy to our honoring and supporting our defenders, veterans, first responders, their families, and those in need through creating and supporting unique programs designed to entertain, educate, inspire, strengthen, and build communities. This support grew from its beginning in New York City to become a nationwide foundation in 2011.

Areas of Service:

- R.I.S.E.
- Relief and Resiliency
- Community and Education
- *First Responders: This program provides grants to provide critical funding for emergency relief, training, and essential equipment.*

Reputation, Transparency and Fiscal Responsibility: From its inception, the Sinise Foundation has been transparent and earned exemplary ratings from 6 different charity evaluators for good governance and other best practices that minimize the chance of unethical activities and consistently executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way.

We spoke with a 2020 grantee who reported the grant is one of the easiest applications he has completed and the foundation generously provided a contact to assist in formulating his grant.

2024 IRS Form 990: The foundation's fiscal year ran from April 1, 2023 – March 31, 2024 and shows net assets of \$80,584,033 of which \$19,104,525 was granted to organizations and individuals. Data extrapolated from the document shows the foundation grants 85% of its donations, using only 15% for salaries and other expenses. Their fundraising efficiency is \$0.05 meaning that they spend only 5 cents for every dollar donated to the foundation.

This grant is a 100% foundation grant with no expenses being asked from the county or any obligation required.



First Responder Grant Application

The grant application window is open all year around, 24/7/365. Grant applications are open for approval for 6 months after the application is submitted. The foundation does not provide feedback on the status of grants until either:

- a. Your grant is approved.
- b. We have questions and reach out to the department.
- c. Your application is denied after the 6 month review period.

Grants are reserved for 'First Responder Departments'. The Gary Sinise Foundation First Responder Outreach Team defines First Responders as "Those individuals called upon in the early stages of an incident that are responsible for the protection and preservation of life, property, evidence, and the environment."

Authorized by the First Responder Outreach Team as:

- Law Enforcement Organizations
- Fire Fighting Organizations
- Emergency Medical Service (EMS) Organizations
- Search and Rescue (SAR) Organizations

Grant requests are limited to Equipment and Training.

- Building and operating costs, such as construction, utility, or land

fees, are not covered under this grant.

Departments are limited to one (1) First Responder Outreach Grant application per calendar year regardless of approval/denial of the application.

All First Responder Departments mentioned above are eligible to submit grant applications. However, the Gary Sinise Foundation First Responder Outreach Department prioritizes volunteer, low, and underfunded departments.

Fire departments awarded grants for turnout gear will be sent Gary Sinise Foundation "Donated By" patches to be added to the coats, at no cost to the department.

NOTE for Law Enforcement Departments: The Gary Sinise Foundation does NOT provide funding for weapons of any type. For the purpose of this grant 'weapons' when used here refers to objects, both lethal and non-lethal, that are used to inflict harm to any degree and may include, but are not limited to:

- Firearms
- Explosives
- Tasers
- Batons
- Tear Gas
- Pepper Spray




Count of Incidents by Incident Type Group and Year
