PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

P.A. 69 RECYCLING UPDATE

Sarah Archer, Iris Waste Diversion Specialists, reviewed the Recycling Program Report dated January 27, 2022 (Appendix A) reported there were over 400,000 pounds of recyclables in 2021. Which is less than 2020 but the costs were \$11,662.95 higher. This was due to the twelve (12) occurrences of oil contamination. The contaminated loads could not be recycled. Even though costs were up, the program was still within budget. Discussion regarding how much recyclables did not make it to market products. All American Waste/GFL materials except glass, goes to products.

The monthly e-newsletter is being transitioned to the County website. The Waste Advisor link and information is being sent to the local municipalities with a request to put it on their websites. Flyers going out and a suggestion to put a QR Code on them to take people to the website.

The EGLE Scrap Tire Grant will be submitted by the Manistee Conservation District for funding. The EGLE Infrastructure Grant was not funded. This hope was that the grant would be used used to make site improvements at the new Onekama Recycling site. Looking for community resources possibly through support letters for cash or in-kind match, Manistee Community Foundation or the Onekama Boosters. A new grant cycle is open until June. The EGLE Materials Management County Engagement Grant was approved by the County Board and is a planning grant which is being applied for by Networks Northwest as a region on behalf of the County.

For operations, the new hauler, GFL, has transitioned into place with Area 31 removing their bins. On the last day of the contract with Area 31, there was a contamination at Brown Township. There have not been problems there at all. Onekama Township is doing an environmental assessment on the proposed new site before they purchase the property.

The Michigan Recycling Coalition Membership is up for renewal. This membership is an advocate for County government for recovery and resource management. The annual membership is \$200. This is a budgeted expense and Ms. Sagala stated it can be paid.

RECYCLING COORDINATOR POSITION

Regarding the Recycling Coordinator Position, an RFP had been issued for this position, but no responses were received by the deadline. A late proposal was received from Bay Area Recycling for Charities (BARC). Ms. Archer worked with Andrew Gale, BARC President, on a "not to exceed" collection contract. The proposal is for three (3) year contract in the amount of \$4,000 month or \$48,000 year with a 3% annual increase. This amount would leave \$10,000 in the budget that could be used for possible grant match or other purposes. Mr. Gale was present on Zoom. He gave a brief history of BARC that started in 2008, added a truck hauling business in 2010 and in 2014, acquired an electronic waste and mattress recycling business. There are currently 27 people on the payroll. The business is in Kaleva, which is located in the middle of Manistee County. Mr. Gale explained how this recycling contract will fit in well with his company and they are excited to move forward and partner with the County. Ms. Sagala concurred with the Committee that BARC is more than qualified to be the new Recycling Coordinator. However, it was noted that the contract should include an out clause. Ms. Sagala will include the RFP (attached) and layout the details of the contract in the County Board packet.

Moved by Batzer, seconded by Gustad to recommend the County accept the response to the RFP from Bay Area Recycling for Charities (BARC) as the County's Recycling Coordinator, for a three (3) year contract, in the amount of \$4,000 month or \$48,000 year with a 3% annual increase, effective February 15, 2022. Ayes: All. Motion Carried.

RECYCLING SITE MONITOR INSPECTION RATE

Ms. Archer noted that Recycling Site Monitors have not had an increase in their pay since 2015. These Site Monitors not only monitor the recycling sites, but they also help with the PCA trailers and clean up of the sites. Ms. Archer requested that the wage of the Recycling Site Monitors be increased from \$20 to \$25 per site visit retroactive to January 1, 2022. Ms. Archer also noted that there is money in the budget for this increase.

Moved by Batzer, seconded by Koons to recommend the wage of the Recycling Site Monitors be increased from \$20 to \$25 per site visit, retroactive to January 1, 2022. Ayes: All. Motion Carried.

RECYCLING PROGRAM MANAGEMENT CONTRACT EXTENSION

The Recycling Program Management position is recommended to be filled by Bay Area Recycling for Charities (BARC), effective February 15, 2022. Ms. Archer has offered to extend her current contract for the month of February 2022 in order to transition her position to BARC. This extension would be the same as her contract extension addendum for January 2022. The extension would be for one (1) month, February 1, 2022 through February 28, 2022 at the rate of \$700 per week.

Moved by Batzer, seconded by Gustad to recommend approval of a contract extension for the Recycling Program Management position between Manistee County and Iris Waste Diversion Specialists, Inc. for the County-wide Recycling Program. The extension would be for one (1) month, February 1, 2022 through February 28, 2022 at the rate of \$700 per week. Ayes: All. Motion Carried.

OTHER ITEMS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Commissioner Koons noted there will be an event in Dublin Heights and other various sites for mono filament regarding fishing lines. This event is in partnership with the Forest Service and the DNR.

The meeting was adjourned at the Call of the Chair at 9:29 a.m.

- PA69 Recycling Program Site Monitor Inspection Rate Increase
 - O Site monitors are currently subcontracted by Manistee County to inspect the PA69 Recycling Program site locations for contamination, litter, and illegal dumping. They are in regular communication with the Recycling Coordinator and as residents of the communities where the recycling drop-off sites are located, are the local eyes on the ground, and essential to the upkeep of the local sites. They are dedicated to maintaining the drop-off sites and communicate with users of the sites about using them properly. Their service is one that goes unnoticed but is critical to the program.
 - o Site monitors receive \$20 per site inspection and have not had an increase in this rate since October 2015. Based upon the regularly scheduled site inspections in 2022 an increase to \$25 per site inspection is within the current budget and highly recommended.
 - o ACTION ITEM Archer requests an increase in the rate for recycling site inspections from \$20 per site inspection to \$25 per site inspection, retroactive to January 1, 2022.



Re: Recycling Program Management RFQ

The Recycling Program Management Request for Proposals was issued on November 29, 2021, with a closing date of December 15, 2021. At the time of the closing date, no proposals were received. This was unexpected as I had conversations with interested parties prior to the issuance of the RFP.

During a phone conversation regarding the status of the RFP, Andy Gale, President of Bay Area Recycling for Charities, indicated they had planned to submit a proposal and explained that due to the timing of the RFP deadline relative to staff changes and the onset of the holiday season, they were unable to meet the December deadline. Given the pending lapse of my contract, I suggested he submit a proposal. I received a proposal via email on January 18, 2022.

After reviewing the proposal, it is my recommendation the Board of Commissioners accept this proposal and award the contract to Bay Area Recycling for Charities. They are a long standing and respected organization and have a local presence and vested interest in Manistee County. They have been willing partners in support of the PA 69 Recycling Program and host the recycling site on the grounds of their facility in Kaleva. They have also provided a location, equipment, and staff support for the Countywide Scrap Tire collection events for the past 3 years.

I have spoken with three references to verify their qualifications and service performance. Both references spoke highly of Andy Gale and his organization and believe they have the skills necessary to manage the recycling program.

We have negotiated a program management fee that is sustainable with the existing program budget.

I am requesting an award of this contract at the Commissioners meeting on February 15, 2022, with the commencement of service on March 1, 2022. The extension of my contract expires on January 31 however, I would agree to another extension until February 28, 2022 to allow time for me to transition the program into the hands of Bay Area Recycling for Charities staff.
