PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE ITEMS

Undersheriff Jason Torrey briefly reviewed the March and April 2022 Monthly Statistics Reports (Appendix A). There were no abnormal activities except there has been a lot of training taking place for the Department. Sheriff Gutowski reviewed the 2021 Annual Use of Force Report (Appendix C). There were 8 occasions of use of force in the Jail and 12 use of force on Road Patrol, which equates to 4.5% of 265 arrests. Sheriff Gutowski noted that this week is Corrections Week and next week is Police Week. The Sheriff would like to do a presentation at the May 2022 County Board Meeting, and he would

like to get on the County Board Agenda to do so. Sheriff Gutowski mentioned the continued work of the School Safety Committee. This Committee is a great partnership.

CITY OF MANISTEE PUBLIC SAFETY ITEMS

Police- Chief Glass: Chief Glass reported he attended graduation for a police cadet that will be working for the City. The new hire will fill the 13th Officer position and they will be fully staffed. With the school liaison program, the City Police will be holding water safety in the schools and at the beach this spring. There is a kids safety day on May 14, 2022 at the Armory Youth Project. The Staff is healthy, and they will be having summer training in June. This will help prepare for a busy summer and events such as the Forest Festival.

Fire- Chief Cameron: Chief Cameron was unable to attend the meeting. However, Chief Glass reported that there was a recent fire outreach event at the library.

MICHIGAN STATE POLICE ITEMS

Lt. Travis House, Post Commander of the Cadillac Post, noted that he appreciates the open communication and solid relationships with numerous agencies that law enforcement has in the County. The State Police will be participating in Kids Safety Day as well as other events in the summer such as the Iron Man in Benzie County and the National Cherry Festival in Traverse City. The MSP detachment facility which is not housed at the Oaks Correctional Facility may be moving to the old elementary school in Maple Grove Township, which has become a community center. This location is centrally located with affordable rent.

TRIBAL POLICE ITEMS

Robert Medacco, Little River Band Public Safety Director, reported that they are down a couple percentage points on their complaints from last year. One (1) officer is out until August as he is at the Police Academy. Three (3) Conservation Officers are at the National Fish & Wildlife Conference in Miami, Fl. The casino has been very busy.

MOBILE MEDICAL RESPONSE (MMR) ITEMS

Paul Owens, noted the two (2) months of new data (Appendix B). There were 174 transports, 70 refusals, and 53 cancelled calls, for a total of 297 calls. Manistee Township was the busiest township for calls. Interviews are being conducted for two (2) EMT's and one (1) paramedic for Manistee. Other possible hiring opportunities is Baker College EMT Boot Camp and Senior Day. MMR also has two (2) paramedic programs. Mr. Owens also reported that six (6) trucks are being replaced with one (1) ambulance coming to Manistee. There are two (2) ambulances in Manistee County on most days, sometimes three (3). One (1) is an ALS and one (1) is a BLS. MMR has 24 hour a day coverage with ALS most days. This is possible by shifting employees around from Traverse City to Manistee. Staffing wise, Jason Sopha took a new job with Guardian

Flight. Mr. Owens announced that he will be retiring on June 17, 2022. The next Operations Manager will hopefully be in place by then.

DNR ITEMS

No Report. – Not present.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR ITEMS

Michael Machen, Deputy 911 Director/Emergency Manager, reported that he attended a mass casualty full school exercise on April 21, 2022 for Region 7. It was a great experience. Mr. Machen also attended a tabletop exercise at the ISD for Fire and Active Shooter Training. The ISD has a solid plan. There was also a Weather Spotter Training class that took place at the EOC. Next week, there will be a Coast Guard Spill Training.

The Ham Radio Group met on April 23, 2022. The Group voted to take down the equipment from the Forest Service Tower and have it installed on the 9-1-1 Marilla Road Tower by the end of August 2022. Quotes should be in soon.

JAIL ADMINISTRATOR ITEMS

Sheriff Gutowski reported that he had no jail statistics. He also mentioned that he attended the WSCC Police Academy graduation for graduate Mason Stapley. Mr. Stapley has been extended a conditional offer of employment. The Sheriff reported that there is a Jail Audit coming soon which entails a lot of paperwork to make sure the Jail is in compliance. They are also working with Wayne State Catholic Human Services with Substance Abuse Disorders and suicidality. The goal is to provide help to those inmates who score higher in these areas at intake. There have been no issues with the Medical Contract that the Jail has with Dr. Custer. There also are only maybe a handful of inmate Emergency Room visits per year.

9-1-1 DIRECTOR ITEMS

Mike Machen, Deputy 911 Director/Emergency Manager, reported that they are now fully staffed with nine (9) fully trained dispatchers and two (2) dispatchers on probation. A completed LEIN Audit with the State and was found to be compliant. The County and City were also compliant. Calls for service compared to a year ago are up 171 calls from this time last year. The three (3) main categories that were up in calls, were traffic calls, 379 in 2021 and in 2022 were 443, criminal history checks were 149 in 2021 and 199 in 2022, and citizens assists were 54 in 2021 and 109 in 2022.

OTHER ITEMS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

It was reported that Chief Mark Cameron is out of state today and that is why he is not present.

Commissioner Goodman mentioned that she has 5-6 boxes of Carter Kits. Ms. Goodman noted that these are kits that are used with persons with autism. Ms. Goodman offered to do training with law enforcement. The refill of these kits is still being researched.

May is Mental Health month. Ms. Goodman reported that educational information is being rolled out.

Law Enforcement is usually first on the scene. A plan for training with law enforcement on Mental health issues is trying to be facilitated.

The meeting was adjourned at the Call of the Chair at 2:50 p.m.

Statutory Authority and Case Law

Under Michigan law, law enforcement officers may use force to protect life and property, to effect arrests, and to prevent escapes. Private persons, except in certain limited circumstances, may only use force in self-defense or in defense of others and must exhaust all attempts to retreat before using deadly physical force, except in their own dwellings. In contrast, law enforcement officers are obligated to take action, and are required to pursue fleeing perpetrators and use force, if necessary, to stop the flight.

The use of force by a law enforcement officer often results from a subject resisting arrest. Resisting arrest is a crime under Michigan law.

Although law enforcement officers achieve compliance in the vast majority of encounters with verbal commands alone, when those commands are insufficient, and subjects choose to ignore instructions or resist, officers may use an array of force options to compel subjects to submit to lawful authority. These options range from physical force, to less-lethal options (e.g., OC Spray, conducted electrical weapons (CEW), or impact weapons), to deadly physical force, when justified by the threat of violence. Law enforcement officers are not required to move sequentially from one level of force to the next. For instance, they may escalate from verbal commands to pointing a CEW or may de-escalate from a threat of force or a use of force to verbal commands, as situations evolve.

Two Supreme Court cases, *Tennessee v. Garner*, 471 U.S. 1 (1985) and *Graham v. Connor*, 490 U.S. 386 (1989), established the constitutional standards for police use of force. *Graham* established a standard of “objective reasonableness” that restricts an officer’s authority to compel or constrain an individual. *Garner* sets forth the standard governing use of deadly force, namely that officers may use deadly when there is probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a threat of serious physical harm.

In *Graham*, the Supreme Court wrote that the “the ‘reasonableness’ of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight.” *Graham* explicitly acknowledges the strain under which officers make life or death use of force decisions.

Manistee County Sheriff’s Office Policy

The Manistee County Sheriff’s Office is committed to providing a high level of law enforcement service to our community. The MCSO Use of Force policy reflects our commitment to adhering to state and federal law when fulfilling that commitment.

The Manistee County Sheriff’s Office Use of Force policy has been certified by the Department of Justice and fulfills the requirements of the Safe Policing for Safe Communities Executive Order. The two required mandates for this Executive Order were that a law enforcement agency Use of Force Policy adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and contain a policy regarding respiratory restraint (commonly known as choke holds). The Manistee County Sheriff’s Office policy not only includes these two required policies, but also includes all the other suggestions within the Executive Order including termination of Use of Force, duty to intervene, training protocols on use of force and de-escalation,

appropriate medical care, warn before shooting, shooting at or from a moving vehicle, warning shots, and no-knock warrants.

The Manistee County Sheriff's Office policy manual requires the Undersheriff to complete an annual Use of Force report for the Sheriff. In the interest of transparency with the community we serve, this Use of Force Report will be presented publicly.

OVERSIGHT

Reporting the Use of Force

The MCSO Use of Force policy requires that any use of force by a member of the MCSO be documented promptly, completely, and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident.

Use of Force Review

Deputies and Corrections Officers are required to notify a supervisor as soon as practicable following the application of force. A copy of the Use of Force incident and report is initially reviewed by the MCSO Use of Force instructor for adherence to policy and training. The Use of Force incident and policy is also reviewed by the Undersheriff to ensure compliance with the Use of Force policy and to address any training issues.

Investigating Misconduct

If a member of the Manistee County Sheriff's Office is accused of misconduct, the Sheriff, Undersheriff, and Jail Administrator begin the initial investigation into the misconduct. If any part of the allegation is substantiated, the investigation is turned over to Michigan Sheriff's Association MISSION investigators.

FIREARMS DISCHARGES

During 2021, the Manistee County Sheriff's Office did not have any incidents where a firearm was discharged to protect from the threat of serious bodily injury or death. Firearms discharges during 2021 were limited to dispatching wild game who were severely injured as a result of vehicle crashes. The Manistee County Sheriff's Office also had no unintentional discharges during 2021.

FIREARMS DISPLAY

During 2021, the Manistee County Sheriff's Office displayed firearms on three occasions. The first incident involved the report of a homicide at a residence. A subject was ordered out of the residence with guns drawn. There was no use of firearms during the incident. This incident was the result of a mental crisis situation. The second incident involved a barricaded gunman where an officer withdrew their firearm in response to the threat of the situation but did not have to use it. The third incident involved a suicidal subject with a firearm. The officer withdrew their firearm due to the situation but did not use it.

CONDUCTED ELECTRICAL WEAPONS

The use of conducted electrical weapons (CEWs) – also referred to as electronic control weapons or tasers – is a less-lethal use of force option for law enforcement personnel. Under MCSO policy, CEWs may be used to control a violent or potentially violent individual. The appropriate use of such a device should result in fewer serious injuries to deputies and suspects.

CEWs use replaceable cartridges containing compressed nitrogen to propel two small probes that are attached to the handheld unit by insulated conductive wires. The wires transmit short controlled pulses of electricity in five-second cycles that stimulate the skeletal muscles of the human body. These short electrical pulses affect the sensory and motor functions of the peripheral nervous system causing temporary incapacitation by preventing coordinated muscular action, without affecting vital organs. Once the five-second cycle is complete, an immediate recovery occurs. CEWs collect and store data regarding each use for post-incident review.

Research conducted by PERF, a nonprofit organization focused on policing issues, suggests that the likelihood of injuries to both suspects and police officers are reduced among agencies that authorize CEW usage compared to those that do not. Every member of the Manistee County Sheriff's Office road patrol division and corrections division are trained and authorized to use CEWs.

The use of the CEWs in cartridge mode is a force option that allows the police to engage noncompliant and/or aggressive subjects from a distance, providing members of our office more time to react and develop a tactical plan in what are typically fast-paced and violent situations. Additionally, CEWs often help members gain rapid control and compliance, thereby minimizing the likelihood of injury or fatal medical consequences for both members and subjects. Of course, when subjects are presenting members of our office or others with an imminent threat of serious bodily harm or death, the use of CEWs may not be the appropriate or reasonable option.

CEW Discharges

Jail

The corrections staff at the Manistee County Jail lodged 556 individuals during 2021. They also provided for the safety and security for an average of approximately 26 inmates (Average Daily Population) each day during 2021.

The Manistee County Jail did not have a single CEW discharge during 2021.

Road Patrol

The Manistee County Sheriff's Office road patrol handled 6,891 calls for service during 2021. Of these complaints, 3,954 resulted in written complaints being filed. The MCSO road patrol also recorded 265 arrests during 2021.

Of those arrests, the road patrol only had one CEW discharge. This one discharge accounts for .004% of all arrests made during 2021, and it also accounts for less than .0003% of the total complaints handled by the Manistee County Sheriff's Office road patrol.

The one discharge incident involved an EDP (Emotionally Disturbed Person) who was threatening his own life with a firearm during his interaction with the deputies.

Injuries

The sole discharge of the CEW by the Manistee County Sheriff's Office resulted in a minor injury to the suspect and no injury to the deputy.

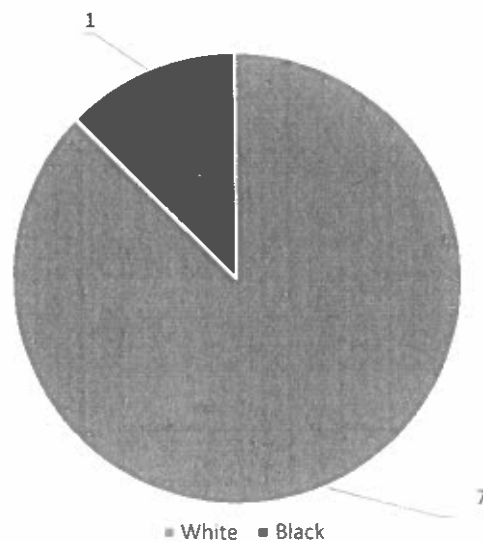
GENERAL USES OF FORCE

General uses of force consist of hands on force utilized to subdue and uncooperative or resistive subject. The general use of force consists of uses of force that do not include tools such as a firearm or CEW. The road patrol is typically forced to use force when a subject refuses to comply or resists arrest. The Manistee County Corrections Staff typically uses force to secure unruly inmates, protect inmates from self-harm, stop fights among inmates, or move uncooperative inmates from their cells.

Jail

The Manistee County Jail Corrections Staff utilized force on 8 occasions during 2021. These 8 use of force incidents were all "hands on" force where inmates failed to comply with verbal commands/orders.

MCSO Use of Force by Race (Jail)



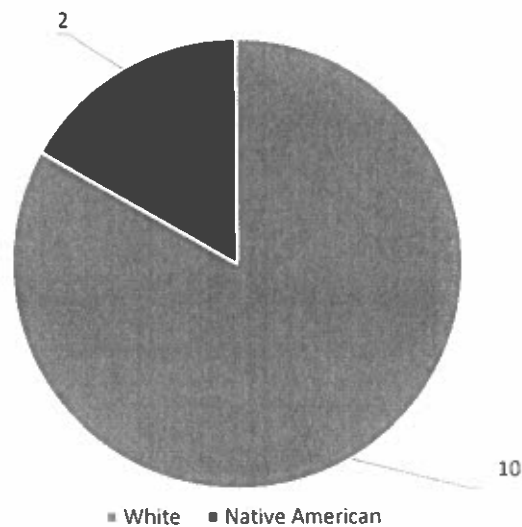
Injuries

The use of force in the Manistee County Jail during 2021 resulted in one injury to an inmate. Two corrections officer sustained injury during two different incidents. The corrections officers did not require treatment. The one inmate received minor injuries for which they were treated.

Road Patrol

The Manistee County Sheriff's Office road patrol utilized force on 12 occasions during 2021. This equates to 4.5% of the 265 arrests made by deputies of the road patrol. This is .3% of all written complaints handled by the road patrol, and .1% of calls for service that resulted in a use of force incident.

Injuries

Of the twelve general use of force incidents from the road patrol, there were 3 suspects treated for minor injuries, but no deputies injuries were reported.
